Bible Verse

3rd gr.+ Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one!
You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart,
With all your soul, and with all your strength. (Deuteronomy 6:4-5)

First Commandment

PreK+ You shall have no other gods.

1st gr.+ *What does this mean?*
We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

Second Commandment

PreK+ You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.

2nd gr.+ *What does this mean?*
We should fear and love God
so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts,
lie or deceive by His name,
but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

Recite - the Apostles’ Creed and the Learn-by-Heart Bible Verse & Catechism

Read and Discuss - one of the Scripture readings from this past Sunday, from school, or the coming Sunday

Pray - the Lord’s Prayer, Luther’s morning or evening prayers, and the topical prayers for the day of the week

Sing a hymn - use one of the hymns from the past Sunday, the coming Sunday, or the school year

Benediction

L: Let us bless the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

L: The Lord bless us, defend us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life.

C: Amen.
